The town will recover of Richardson for term fees as defendant a part of my fees for attendance, In assuming the office of town agent, last spring, I found four suits pending in the county court against the town, to wit: Richardson's horse suit, Powers' bounty suit to recover a bounty of \$500, and Moore's suit for work on a bridge. Moore's suit was appealed from a Justice suit by the town; Moore recovered \$47 before the Justice. The selectmen settled with Moore, paying him \$40, each one paying their own costs. Richardson's suit was tried last March term, the town coming out victorious, recovering their costs; our costs, as allowed by the court, amounts to \$262; the execution is in the hands of the sheriff; the money will be paid soon, no doubt, and the witnesses from Clarendon will get their fees. Powers' bounty suit was withdrawn by the plaintiff, last September term, he being satisfied that he could not recover. The other suit, Dyer bounty suit, is now pending with a fair prospect that the plaintiff will withdraw that. I congratulate the town on their success in their law suits; it costs money notwithstanding we recover.
