- Article 13. Otter Creek Grange voted a Tax Exemption—Yes 158—No 102.
- Article 14. Authorization of \$300.00 for Rutland Regional Planning Commission. Yes 123, No 131.
- Article 15. Authorization asked for kindergarten—Yes 129, No 132.
- Article 16. General Tax voted for ensuing year for current expenses of the General Account—Yes 195, No 68.

- Article 17. On question of doing away with Australian Ballot System—Ammendment suggested—Do away with Australian Ballot as we now have it. Vote for officers by Australian Ballot, and on other business from the floor. Motion was not seconded. By acclamation undecided—Call for Ballot—No 84, Yes 40.
- Article 18. To transact any other business.

 Motion made and seconded that the Road Commissioner be paid \$3.00 per hour. Voted yes by acclamation.

 Town voted by acclamation to exempt both fire houses from taxation for a period of five years.

Motion made and seconded for 25 cents hourly pay increase for road help. Carried by acclamation.

Motion made and seconded that the Selectmen have

Motion made and seconded that the Selectmen has a budget. Carried by acclamation.

The evening meeting was recessed until the following day when voting by Australian Ballot was done.

All business completed the meeting was adjourned at 7:00 P.M.

Other former Town Officers, Mr. Harold Johnson who served in various offices passed away in April and Charles Ruane who was also a Town Officer for many years passed away in

February.

Eloise Pratt who was Assistant Town Clerk at the time of her mother-in-law's death consented to fill this position and let the office remain in her home, and we were very fortunate to have Frederic Greenwood fill the unexpired term of Percy Teer.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL DIRECTORS AND THE SUPERINTENDENT

The new elementary school has been in use now since September. The teachers and pupils have had to adjust themselves to this new facility and are now beginning to adapt to the new situation.

Our enrollment has steadily increased since the opening of school and has now reached a total of 280 pupils. Several of our grades are very large and we shall have to add more teachers another year to handle the increase.

The school bonds have now been sold to the Vermont Municipal Bond Bank at a favorable rate of interest. The first payment of principal and interest will come due in 1971. As we provided the money for payment in the present year's budget, we will set this aside for next year. The \$10,000 on the debt plus the \$22,000.00 in this year's budget minus the interest charges on the notes will be set aside towards this payment.

As required by law, the School Directors have warned the annual school district meeting and included articles on the kindergarten and the sum of money (\$190,000) requested to operate your schools for the next fiscal year. Also they have asked for a vote on buying a piece of property near the school and selling two school buildings and land.

The budget for the next fiscal year shows an increase in tuition costs because there will be approximately 93 Clarendon pupils attending high schools. This is an increase of 13 over the number during the present year. The other large item is for teachers' salaries and the increase is due to the need for more teachers next year to handle the increased enrollment.

The total budget request for the next school year is \$277,200.00. This amount is very nearly the same as this years budget.

CLARENDON FIRE ASSOCIATION

Our membership, as of October 1, 1970, was 38 members. This figure changes from time to time as members move out of town or do not renew their membership. However, new members are welcomed to our association, keeping the membership fairly constant.

A 45-hour Firemanship Course was completed in the Spring of 1970 by six members of our Fire Department. This taught new firemen the science of fire, use of ladders, hose layouts, pumps, relays, entry, ventilation, rescue and other knowledgeable information useful to a good fireman. Five firemen attended the Vermont State Fire Fighters Association Fire Academy at Norwich University on August 22 and 23, 1970. Those who attend this academy find their training useful in our Fire Department. Training locally consists of practice with our trucks, familiarizing firemen with our equipment and procedures.

Our Fire Department attended the 81st Annual Vermont State Fire Fighters Association Convention held in Rutland, Vermont on August 8 and 9. All members of our Department are very proud to report that for the second year in a row, they returned home from the convention with a trophy for "The Best Appearing Marching Unit" (In State). In addition, two first place trophies out of a possible four in sporting events were awarded to the Clarendon Fire Department.

The Clarendon Fire Association still sponsors the local Boy Scout Troop. The fire house meeting room is used for their meeting place and activities. In addition to this, the meeting room has been used by the Town Planning Commission; a flight school; plus activities and meetings directly associated with the Fire Department.

A committee of five men, 2 trustees and 3 firemen was formed in mid-summer to gather and study information on the costs of purchasing a replacement truck chassis for our North Clarendon tanker which is 24 years old. They reported prior to October 1st that the costs of a good used chassis were high and recommended purchasing a new cab and chassis when the time came. This committee was for the truck only. The type tank to be built was decided more recently.

The Clarendon Volunteer Fire Department answered 14 calls (October 1969—October 1970). The breakdown is: mutual

aid, 3; grass fire type, 3; vehicle, 3; structure or mobile home, 3; miscellaneous, 2.

It is impossible to count the hours, mileage, and personal costs that the members of the Clarendon Volunteer Fire Department contribute just in training, attending meetings, or answering alarms. The Townspeople of Clarendon can be proud to have a Fire Association of this type within the bounds of their community. You have shown us your thanks in past years by answering our requests by a most gracious vote. This year we are asking the Town to donate \$2,500.00 toward our support. We trust you will find us worthy of this amount and support us on Town Meeting Day.

VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE Montpelier, Vermont

TOWN OF CLARENDON

This is the third year that this Department, as a courtesy, has reported to each town and city the amounts spent and people aided in each locality under the various Social Welfare programs. This report replaced the previous annual notification to each town of the charges that had been assessed against their community for their share of State operated welfare programs. The enactment, by the General Assembly, of the Social Welfare Act of 1967, eliminated sharing in State welfare costs at the local level and, as a result, the requirement for reporting to the towns.

All of the figures reported this year are for calendar year 1970 except the General Assistance figures which are for fiscal

year 1970, that is, the twelve month period ending June 30, 1970. General Assistance is the program that was formerly operated by your Overseer of the Poor. Monthly average number of recipients is a monthly average of total people served, except in General Assistance where the count is of cases rather than total people within the cases as the latter count is not available.

The above figures do not include money payment recipients residing in nursing homes or mental hospitals as there does not appear to be a fair way of assigning a town of residence to these people.

In addition medical vendor payments for the calendar year 1970 totaled about \$15,000,000 (more than one-third of all Department expenditures) and payments in behalf of committed children totaled over \$1,400,000 for a monthly average of over 1,550 children. No doubt, residents of your community were numbered among those who benefited by these expenditures.

Qualifications for a Legal Voter

"A citizen is qualified to vote in a municipal meeting if by the meeting day he is twenty-one years of age, has taken the Freeman's Oath and has resided in this State one year and in the municipality one hundred and eighty days next preceding the meeting.
